Wonderful Steller Community:

I am so glad to welcome all of our new and returning students and families to Steller Secondary for the 2012-2013 school year. We are currently still in the interview process for a new Special Education Department Chair and a Resource Teacher, and we are in need of a Math teacher for two hours a day. Other than that, everyone else is returning to Steller, and I can't be happier. Our two rels have gotten new stairways and new ramps, and our vent for the washer and dryer has been installed. I am hoping to have a car wash in the near future to raise the money for a stackable washer and dryer. We'll get the best for Steller through our own hard work.

Registration:

Registration will be from **8:00 AM to 2:00 PM on August 7 and 8** in the Multi-Purpose Room. If you know in advance that you can't make any of the registration/activation dates, please call either Elizabeth or Michelle at 742-4950 to let them know when to expect you.

Parking:

It is school board policy that all students that park in the school district parking lots must have a parking permit and that permit will cost \$55.00 per semester. Students must pick up a Vehicle Registration and Parking form from the office. Please pay for the permit in the office. There will be spot checks of the vehicles in the parking lot to make sure you have an updated car permit. If you do not have a permit a warning is issued for the first offense, a fine is issued for the second offense, and you will be towed at your expense if there is a third offense. Also if you drive to another school for activities or for classes and park in their parking area you must have a permit. Please be aware that each school has their own fine system for their parking areas.

Permits from our school will be ok in other school lots, but it is a good idea to let the other school know you are parking in their lot.

Vehicle safety is important. Please do not speed in the driveway or parking lot. Do not overload your car with passengers, as this is very dangerous for all concerned. Please make sure you drive responsibly. Our school is about responsible freedom, which means just that, freedom to be responsible in all things you do and making proper choices. If proper choices are not made, those freedoms that we all cherish may be taken away.

We encourage all visitors to please check in at the office. This allows us to know who is in the building for security and fire purposes and helps alleviate confusion about non-permitted cars in Steller's parking lot.

Fire Lane:

The front access drive is a Fire Lane. Dropping off and picking students up is fine, but we cannot have anyone parking there. Any car parked in the Fire Lane (without a driver in the auto) may be fined or towed at the owner's expense. There will be no warnings given out for this.

When we are having an emergency and/or drill and you are parked in the front access drive be aware of students coming out of the doors and PLEASE move your car to the parking area of the school as soon as you are able. We, as a staff, do not have the time to locate the owner of a car in the event of a real emergency. Our first concern is the safety of the students. Your car can also block an emergency vehicle trying to get to the school in a timely manner. Please do not try to pick up your child at the time of the emergency or drill. It causes too much confusion and increases risks for our students. The students will be released at the proper time after the event.

Steller Safety:

Safety at Steller is of high importance to the staff. A safe environment is essential to students. I would like to address a few of the safety issues.

- Stay in a group when leaving the school for lunch or walking to a bus. Do not walk or wander down back alleys just because it is a short cut. These areas are danger zones and should be avoided at all costs. If anyone approaches you that you do not know, do not talk to them, run to the nearest safe place and report it at once.
- If there is a person or a student in our building that you know does not belong to the school, please let any staff member know right away. Do not confront them, let the staff member ask who they are and their business.
- Riding bikes to and from school: Please do not ride bikes on the school sidewalks or parking lots – WALK THEM. Many other things are going on at the same time and an accident can happen. Remember to wear helmets at all times when riding a bike on school property.
- Skateboards may not be ridden on school property

Introducing ASD iSchool

ASD's online program now has a new look and feel. Formerly known as MyHigh, ASD iSchool is a program that supplements face to face options for students grades 9-12 as well as 6th graders who qualify for early entry PreAlgebra. The goal of ASD iSchool is to allow students to have more flexibility in their schedule by taking a class online rather than in a traditional classroom setting. Whether a student is new to the district and needs to earn a required credit or simply a student who would like to free up space in his/her schedule, ASD iSchool offers the opportunity to take both core and elective classes as an original course attempt.

Successful students should be self-motivated with strong reading and writing skills and must be enrolled as an ASD student in either a comprehensive or alternative school. Though the program is flexible, students are encouraged to pace themselves according to the suggested class due dates in order to receive an accurate grade for both progress and final grade marking periods. Most classes are NCAA approved and qualify for sports eligibility. Classes are filled on a first come, first served basis and a subject to cancellation if the minimum class size requirement is not met.

Steller Visitor Policy

1. Parents of Steller students and Alumni are welcomed anytime before, during and after school
2. Anyone who visits the school must check in at the office, and sign in the computer.
3. A Steller student may arrange to sponsor a student visitor with prior written approval of all the teachers involved, the Steller Principal, the visitor's parent or guardian, and the visitors home school. This approval must be given no later than 24 hours prior to the class.
4. The Principal or any staff member may refuse anyone the right to visit and may ask anyone who is visiting to leave.



Nurse's Notes

Immunizations Due

Many students will need immunization boosters prior to school starting and during the school year. The immunization must be received and documentation provided to the school prior to attending classes. The State of Alaska has a strict "NO SHOT, NO SCHOOL" policy. Reminder letters are mailed out monthly and several months prior to your students immunization due date. Free immunizations are available at a variety of locations. Please contact the nurse with any questions or concerns.

Allergy/Anaphylaxis

Steller Secondary is a LATEX-FREE environment. Do not bring latex gloves, balloons, or other items made of latex into the building. Parents of children with a known anaphylactic reaction especially to food, animals, or bee/wasp sting must provide the school with an Allergy/Anaphylaxis Plan completed by a physician. The nurse reviews the plan and gives a copy to the student's teachers. Teachers are trained to administer the epinephrine auto-injector and it will go with the child on field trips. If you need a copy of the Allergy/Anaphylaxis Plan to take to your doctor please contact the school nurse.

Asthma

If your student is prescribed an inhaler we must have an Asthma Action Plan on file. If you need a copy of the Asthma Action Plan to take to your doctor please contact the school nurse.

PE Excuses

If a student will need to be out of PE for more than three days a written request from a physician is necessary.

The excuse must specify the length of the absence (including the return date,) and the reason for it.

Medication

If your child requires medication during the school day please contact the nurse for the required paperwork. All medication must be provided in the original container. The nurse cannot give out any loose medication that is sent to school in a baggie. Students are prohibited by ASD policy from carrying controlled substance medications, such as those prescribed for ADD/ADHD, to school to give to the nurse. An adult must bring in this medication. All controlled medications must be counted by the nurse in view of the parent/guardian. For questions regarding medication administration at school please call the nurse.
