Grade Level: 8-12

Description: Earn a PE credit exploring the front range of the Chugach Mountains and working with local groups to help maintain and improve local trails! Hikes will include traverses and individual peaks. Some hikes we may complete are Turnagain Arm Trail, Wolverine Peak, Middle Fork Loop, and McHugh Peak. We will also have guest speakers to help us prepare with appropriate gear and wildlife safety. Participants need to be motivated and in moderate shape but do not need hiking experience; expect to walk 5-10 miles a day with moderate elevation gain.

Grade Level: 8-12

Description: Geocaching allows you to use multi-million dollar satellites to find treasure almost anywhere in the world! Everyone loves finding treasure, and geocaches are everywhere. In this intensive, you will learn the specifics of what geocaching is, you will use the aforementioned multi-million dollar satellites to find the geocaches, and you will even build your own geocaches. You will also be introduced to other forms of modern-day scavenger hunts. After you learn the basics, we will be spending the majority of the intensive outside searching for geocaches while hiking around Anchorage.
