## Applications due Feb. 1 for scholarships, high school journalism conference at Newseum

Washington, D.C. — High school juniors with a passion for journalism have until Feb. 1, 2016, to apply for the annual Al Neuharth Free Spirit and Journalism Conference, June 18-23, 2016, at the Newseum in Washington, D.C.

Eligibility is limited to students who are interested in journalism careers, who demonstrate qualities of "free spirit" and who are high school juniors in the 2015-2016 academic year. Online applications and more information are available at www.freespirit.org.

The Al Neuharth Free Spirit program will select, teach, mentor and support 51 outstanding high school students, representing each of the 50 states and Washington, D.C. They will participate in an all-expenses-paid journalism training conference at the Newseum, located on Pennsylvania Avenue between the U.S. Capitol and the White House.
