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#### **Passages Highlights**

High school students are hard at work on their passages this semester. We have a wide range of passages, from students exploring careers in the medical field, to students learning wood-working, to students reopening the Temple of the Bean Cafe here at Steller. Students work with their advisor for a semester or longer self-designed class to pursue their interests and passions. They create a proposal, find a mentor, and document their growth and learning while collaborating with classmates and their advisor. Students must complete a minimum of three passages to graduate from Steller, including at least one that includes community service. The other categories for passages are: adventure, career exploration, creativity, logical inquiry, and practical skills. Students, whether in middle school or high school, should always be thinking about what interests and questions they could explore in a passages format for the future. Here are a few highlights of current passages in students' own words:

I'm doing my passage on working with energetic 7th - 9th graders in 3rd period Mythology and 4th period Alaska Studies. Making students engage in academic activities and forming bonds with the students is extremely fun and provides experience for the future. - Jason Custer, 12th grade
