One of the unique aspects of Steller is that students have the opportunity to teach each other. Students who have a speciality in a particular area can propose a peer taught class to the Steller staff and teach it in the coming semester with a sponsor teacher. Peer taught classes vary from language learning, PE, game design, and literature.

This semester Adara Lee is teaching a Creative Writing course. In her class she is having students create worlds

based upon a character they develop. Each week they work on a different aspect of that world - government, species, biospheres, etc. Adara says she is surprised by her students' creativity, their funny ideas, and how difficult it is to get students to turn in their work on time! The students are building folders with all of their ideas to culminate in a short story.

Rowan Pickard is teaching a How to Make a Movie course. Each week he focuses on a different aspect of video production including lighting, audio, and editing. At the end of the semester the students will be divided into two groups to create production crews and produce two short films.

Both students highly recommend teaching a peer taught. They worked hard to prepare for their new role as a teacher and they're learning lots while in that role. They both mentioned developing better leadership skills as well as teaching skills. Adara says that this role is definitely out of her comfort zone, but she psychs herself by being compassionate to herself and her students and being overly prepared.
